## A LOT OF

The meaning of **a lot of** is the same as the meaning of **many** and **much**.

We use **a lot of** for things we can count and things we cannot count.

I've got **a lot of** milk in my fridge. I've got **a lot of** friends in this town.

For example: I've got a lot of friends.

ARE THERE FEW VILLAGES IN THIS COUNTRY?

No, there aren't few villages in this country, but there are a lot of villages in this country.

DOES IT TAKE YOU LITTLE TIME TO DO YOUR HOMEWORK?

No, it doesn't take me little time to do my homework, but it takes me a lot of time to do my homework.

DO YOU TAKE FEW BOOKS WITH YOU TO SCHOOL EVERY DAY?

No, I don't take few books with me to school every day, but I take a lot of books with me to school every day.

DO SMALL CHILDREN EAT A LOT OF FOOD?

No, small children don't eat a lot of food, but they eat little food.
