## mixed conditionals $2^{nd} + 3^{rd}$ type

A mixed conditional is a combination of the second and third conditionals. We use it when something that happened in the past influences the present. For example: If I had studied harder at university, I would be a managing director now.

The if-clause is a third conditional. It means that I didn't study very hard. The main clause is a second conditional. It means I'm not a director now.
