Let's Study!

Have to

– when something is necessary and you have no choice

I **have to** study for tomorrow's exams.

Erick **has to** clean the house before his parents arrive.

He **had to** buy some lemons first before he could make lemon juice.

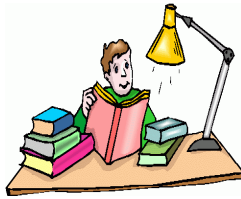
Don't have to

- when something is NOT necessary or not required.

I **don't have to** do the laundry. My mom does it for me.

Erick **doesn't have to** clean the house.

They **don't have to** come early tonight.
