* share visible differences between the rich and the poor in one's country; discuss how the rich and the poor are treated in their country; suggest ways that could equalize the treatment of both worlds.





Read the Passage:

The common phrases used to describe the rich world include, "the developed countries" and "the advanced industrial countries". To describe very poor countries, we usually refer to "The Third World".

It can be more **diplomatic** to speak of "the developing countries", though this **description** is often applied to countries which are not so very poor. **Economists** also refer to "the North South divide" to **emphasize** that countries in the northern hemisphere are generally richer than those in the southern hemisphere namely Africa and Latin America. People in the rich world have mixed **attitude** towards giving **aid** to Third World countries. As for the question, 'who must help who?' is still a big question for everybody.
