

A: Excuse me. Does this bus go to Tokyo?
B: No, this goes to Hiroshima. I think Lane 8 is for Tokyo.
A: The Lane 8 bus?
B: Yes. It will leave 5 minutes from now.
A: Where can I buy the ticket?
B: At window 3.
A: Thank you.

Useful Expressions:

1. Excuse me or pardon me

2. Yes, uh-huh (informal) or that's right
3. Thank you, thank you very much or thanks (informal)

Other questions used in asking for travel information:
Q. How do you get to $\qquad$ (name of place)?
A. Possible answers: by bus, by car, by plane, on foot

Example: Q. How do you get to your school?
A. I go to school by bus.
Q. What is the best way to get to work if you live from (address) and you work in (location of your workplace)?

Example: Q. What is the best way to get to your school if you live from Maine Street and your school is at the center of the city?
A. By train. It takes me just 5 minutes from home to school.
Q. Which airline has the cheapest flight to (destination)?

Example: Q. Which airline has the cheapest flight to Hong Kong from Japan?
A. Bangkok Air has the cheapest price.
