Capital punishment, also known as the death penalty, is the execution of a person by the state as punishment for a crime. Crimes that can result in a death penalty are known as capital crimes or heinous crime. In most places today, death penalty is reserved as punishment for premeditated murder, espionage, treason, or in a military court-marshal verdict. In some countries, sexual crimes, such as, sexual assault and extramarital relationship also carry a death sentence, similar to religious crimes., like apostasy.
