

FOOD TAXES CAUSE RIOTS

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti (AP) -- Haiti's president tried to halt a week of rioting by calling for tax cuts on imported food, but the capital descended deeper into chaos as looters and protesters took control of the streets. Bands of young men carrying sticks and rocks set up roadblocks of burning tires. Mobs looted stores, warehouses and government offices, and gunfire rang through slums and upscale neighborhoods alike.

Food prices, which have risen 40 percent are causing unrest around the world. But they pose a particular threat to democracy in Haiti, where most people live on less than \$2 a day.
