TOKYO — Japan's five-year commitment period to trim down greenhouse Gas emissions under the Kyoto Protocol began on Tuesday as industries, households, and transport and other sectors increase energy-saving efforts to curb global warming.

To meet the target, Japan plans to rely on forest absorption for a cut of 3.8% and the acquisition of emissions credits from broad for a reduction of 1.6%, meaning that the country would effectively be obliged to cut domestic emissions by 0.6%. The six greenhouse gases covered by the Kyoto Protocol are carbon dioxide, methane, dinitrogen monoxide, hydrofluorocarbon, perfluorocarbon and sulfur hexafluoride.
