

At the Customs





(Jun at the customs)

Customs Officer: Next. Your passport please. Jun: Okay. Customs Officer: What is the purpose of your visit? Jun: I'm here for a factory vist, the Kowloon Company, just for a couple of days. Things You'll Need at the customs:

- Copies of your exit ticket (plane or train)
- Passport
- Visa
- Address and phone number of a contact who is a resident in the country that you are visiting.
- Bank statement

Customs Inspection Steps to check and prepare to have a smooth entry.

- Step1. Before departing for a foreign trip, check the government website of the country you're visiting whether you will need to pay for a visa upon arrival (if you must pay in cash, check to see what currency is acceptable), if you need to apply for a visa in advance, or if there are any other requirements.
- Step2. Have your valid passport, correct visa, and customs declaration completely filled out, and be sure that all letters are legible.
- Step3. Be prepared to state your reason for visiting. You may also be asked personal questions that you may deem indiscreet or inapproriate. Answer as calmly and as honestly as possible.
- Step 4. Have a bank statement, exit plane/train ticket, and the address of a friend who you will be visiting (or at least a hotel reservation).
